

**Carl Gustav Jung:
A Biography

Carl Jung was a famous Swiss psychiatrist (1875-1961). Initially Jung was a follower of Sigmund Freud, the father of psychoanalysis but eventually Jung became disoriented with Freud's atheism and intolerance of spirituality. Jung had several paranormal events in his life which made him open minded about such phenomena. He had an interest in flying saucers and wrote a book about them. He felt they were both a physically real phenomenon and a psychologically important phenomenon. The biography reviewed here describes aviator Charles Lindbergh's trip to Switzerland to see Jung. Lindbergh criticized Jung for his interest in UFOs (page 508) and stated that USAF General Spaatz had told Lindbergh "don't you suppose that if there was anything true about this flying saucer business you and I would have learned about it by this time?" Jung disagreed with this view and told Lindbergh "There are a great many things going on around this earth that you and General Spaatz don't know about."
